MHRB, Franklin Fire Department partner on NaloxBox

MASON, OHIO, August 26, 2021 - Residents of Franklin now have some additional help to save the life of someone experiencing an opiate overdose.

The Mental Health Recovery Board Serving Warren & Clinton Counties (MHRB) recently provided a NaloxBox to the Franklin Fire Department to place in their building on East 4th Street. Anyone who sees someone in trouble or believes they may need Naloxone to treat an overdose can access the box anonymously.

The NaloxBox was purchased through a grant funded by the Ohio Department of Mental Health & Addiction Services and the Ohio Department of Health.

"The point of the NaloxBox is to save as many lives as possible," said Colleen Chamberlain, MHRB executive director. "This grant allows us to work with local municipalities like Franklin that are experiencing high numbers of overdoses. We want to save lives and get people into and staying in treatment so they can be there for their families and their communities."
