FY21 SERVICE POPULATIONS AND BENEFIT RULES FOR MHRB CONTRACT PROVIDERS

Prevention Services

Service Population:

Any Warren/Clinton Resident

Benefit Rule:

There is no charge to any Warren or Clinton County school, agency, entity or individual participant for this service. MHRB provides funding to contract agencies for the provision of these FREE services to the Warren and Clinton County community.

Crisis Services

Service Population:

Any individual in Warren or Clinton Counties is eligible for crisis services.

Service Array:

- Crisis Hotline
- Mobile Response and Stabilization Service (MRSS)
- Pre-Screening for Psychiatric Hospitalization/Mobile Crisis
- Quick Response Teams (QRT) after Overdoses
- School Crisis services

Benefit Rule:

There is no charge for calling the crisis hotline. There is no out-of-pocket charge for MRSS or a Pre-Screening for a psychiatric hospitalization, however Medicaid or private insurance may be billed. When deployed after an incident, School Crisis Services are provided at no charge to schools/students.

Mental Health Outpatient Services

Service Population:

- Children exhibiting behavioral evidence of mental health issues and their families.
- Adolescent age youth exhibiting mental health disturbances, or those at high risk of substance abuse/dependency and/or mental health disturbances as indicated by familial, vocational, medical difficulties, juvenile court involvement or school disciplinary actions.
- Adults exhibiting mental health issues as indicated by familial, vocational or medical difficulties, judicial or law enforcement involvement.

Billing Order & Benefit Rule:

1. Private Insurance: Insurance covers for most clinical services.
2. Medicaid: Medicaid pays for clinical services (treatment).

3. MHRB Subsidy for Warren and Clinton County Residents (through the support of the local levy, state and federal funds) is based upon a Sliding Fee Scale. For those individuals who have a household income at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL), 100% subsidy is available, meaning they are eligible for services with no out of pocket expenses. For those who are from 251%-400% FPL, graduated subsidy levels are provided (see Sliding Fee Schedule). This subsidy will be applied towards:
 - o Any private insurance co-pays or deductibles.
 - o Any clinical service which is not covered by Private Insurance or Medicaid if deemed medically necessary.
 - o Any MHRB contracted non-clinical service which is not covered by Private Insurance or Medicaid.
 - o For a client who does not have any medical coverage, MHRB can be billed for clinical services as long as deemed medically necessary. The expectation is that the individual will secure insurance coverage within 180 days. The provider agency will assist family in securing this coverage.
4. Responsible Party: Any amount not covered under the above will be billed to the responsible party.

Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) Youth Services

Service Population (accordance Ohio Administrative Code 5122-24-01):

- Under eighteen years of age; *MHRB Exception*: Service has been extended to Youth aged 18-21
- Marked to severe emotional/behavioral impairment (defined as lack of self-care activities, suicidal preoccupation, school refusal, obsessive rituals, frequent anxiety attacks, aggressive behavior, severe depression/psychosis)
- Impairment that seriously disrupts family or interpersonal relationships (defined as involvement of police, courts, or other systems; inability to participate in age-appropriate activities, community is unable to tolerate behavior; or behavior is life-threatening)
- May require the services of other youth-serving systems (e.g., education, human services, juvenile court, health, mental health/mental retardation, youth services, and others).

Billing Order & Benefit Rule:

1. Private Insurance: Insurance covers for most clinical services.
2. Medicaid: Medicaid pays for clinical services (treatment) up to a cap established by the State of Ohio
3. MHRB Subsidy for Warren and Clinton County Residents (through the support of the local levy, state and federal funds): MHRB provides a subsidy, regardless of family income, which covers the balance of any clinical outpatient service plus contracted services which are not typically covered by private insurance, such as consultation and case management services. Thus, there is no out-of-pocket cost for SED outpatient services.

Outpatient Addiction Services including Alcohol & Other Drugs and Gambling Treatment

Service Population:

- Adults or adolescents with a primary diagnosis of a substance use disorder (SUD) and their families
- Individuals with a primary or secondary diagnosis related to problem gambling
- Individuals with co-occurring (SUD and MH) disorders

Billing Order & Benefit Rule:

Same as Mental Health Outpatient Services (see above)
